School year placed on list: *This is the school year the school was placed on the Program Improvement list. A school is placed on this list when it fails to meet any of the federal performance benchmarks for two consecutive years. Likewise, to be removed from the list a school must meet all federal performance benchmarks for two consecutive years.*

Met all: *"Yes" means the school met all federal minimum pass rates last school year and the school will exit the list if it continues to meet all federal guidelines on next spring's tests. "No" means the school did not meet all federal guidelines and must meet all federal guidelines over the next two school years to be removed from the list.*
